In addition, we will continue our efforts to promote early identification and effective treatment, strength-based skill enrichment and self-advocacy, and expansion of evidence-based therapeutic and educational programs that provide access to realistic community experiences.

Over the next 15 years, more than 12 million children with neurodiverse disorders will reach adulthood in the U.S. alone.

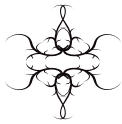

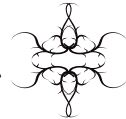
